

Farooq A. Bandali, Pharm.D.

Biography

Dr. Farooq A Bandali earned his Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Texas at Austin in 2000. For three years thereafter, he worked as a pharmacist, the first year, as a community pharmacist, and the next two years as a staff/clinical pharmacist at Bridgeport Hospital, in Bridgeport, Connecticut. During the time period as well, he was also a lecturer at Norwalk Community College.

During 2004 – 2005, Dr. Bandali completed an ASHP-accredited pharmacy practice residency at Charleston Area Medical Center, in Charleston, West Virginia. Subsequently, in 2005 – 2006, he completed another ASHP-accredited residency in critical care at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) in Charleston, South Carolina.

Presently, Dr. Farooq is a Clinical Assistant Professor at Ernest Mario School of Pharmacy at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey. His practice site is at Saint Peter's University Hospital where he is a Critical Care Clinical Pharmacist. His teaching responsibilities include precepting pharmacy students on rotations and delivering didactic lectures at EMSOP. His practice responsibilities include rounding daily on intensive care unit patients to assist medical teams in optimizing pharmacotherapy outcomes.

Some of his research interests include severe sepsis and the off-label use of recombinant factor VIIa in critically ill patients.

He is a member of the American Society of Health-System Pharmacist, American College of Clinical Pharmacy and the Society of Critical Care Medicine.
