Develop expertise in analyzing cases in pharmacy practice that require a blending of the principles of pharmaceutical law and professional ethics.

Use the case study method to acquire the skills needed to make prudent, ethical decisions relative to providing patients with access to high cost biotechnology-derived drugs.

Apply the ethical principles of beneficence, non-maleficence, autonomy and justice in professionally and legally discharging the pharmacist's duty to counsel and warn patients about the adverse effects associated with drugs.

Balance legal and ethical considerations in making decisions involving the maintenance of patient confidentiality encountered by pharmacists with regard to prescription records and patient counseling activities.

Interact legally and ethically in dealing with the pharmaceutical industry with regard to industry support of marketing-related activities, continuing education programs, and the conduct of investigational clinical trials.

Distinguish legal responsibilities from ethical responsibilities in the practice of pharmacy analyzing relevant case law involving a pharmacist in community, hospital and industry practice settings.

Recognize the legal responsibility of a pharmacist to counsel patients, monitor drug therapy and ensure the confidentiality of patients's health information.

Assess and analyze the legal responsibility of a pharmacist involved in marketing-related activities, the conduct of investigational clinical trials and filings with regulatory agencies.
