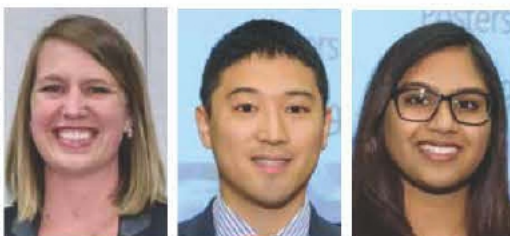


Stone, Buckley, and Jain Garner Best Poster Honors

The more than 500 posters presented at the 2017 Annual Meeting described original research; innovative clinical pharmacy services and programs; case reports; systematic reviews/meta-analyses; and student, resident, and fellow research-in-progress. Three Best Poster Awards winners delivered platform presentations of their research.

Best Poster Award

ACCP Announces Upcoming Launch of New Journal

A highlight of the Phoenix meeting was the announcement that Pharmacotherapy Publications, Inc. (PPI), ACCP's corporate journal-publishing unit, will begin publishing ACCP's second official journal in October 2018.

The new *Journal of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy (JACCP)* will publish papers across the spectrum of clinical pharmacy practice. *JACCP* will be distributed online to ACCP members, who will see no increase in membership dues. Members will also continue to receive monthly issues of *Pharmacotherapy*, the *Journal of Human Pharmacology and Drug Therapy*.

Jerry L. Bauman, Pharm.D., FCCP, FACC will serve as editor-in-chief of *JACCP*. Dr. Bauman is a dean and distinguished professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago (UIC) College of Pharmacy and the Department of Medicine, Section of Cardiology. Dr. Bauman's area of research is the clinical pharmacology of cocaine and the drugs used to treat cardiac

rhythm disorders. He has published extensively in these areas and received the Russell Foundation Award for Research from the American College of Clinical Pharmacy as a result. He was the first to be elected as fellow of the American College of Clinical Pharmacy and recently retired after a decade of service as the editor for *Pharmacotherapy*.

Dr. Bauman has been a member of a panel of scholars in the editorial office of *Pharmacotherapy*, Pharm.D., FCCP, Phillips, Pharm.D., BCPS, BCACP; and Pharm.D., FCCP will be associate editors of *JACCP*.

JACCP will be published in January and new journal will serve as a forum for discussions of clinical pharmacy practice research and training. It will publish official and policy papers and Pharmacy Specialties modules.
