Hackensack Meridian *Health* Jersey Shore University Medical Center (JSUMC) is a not-for-profit teaching hospital and home to K. Hovnanian Children's Hospital – the first children's hospital in Monmouth and Ocean counties. With more than 1,000 physicians and dental staff in 60 specialty areas, JSUMC's team provides quality care in a patient centered, environmentally friendly setting. Through the hospital's clinical research program and longstanding commitment to medical education through an affiliation with Ernest Mario School of Pharmacy, Rutgers University and Seton Hall - Hackensack Meridian School of Medicine, JSUMC serves as an academic center dedicated to advancing medical knowledge, training future health care professionals and providing the community with access to promising medical breakthroughs. Jersey Shore University Medical Center specializes in cardiovascular care, orthopedics, rehabilitation, cancer care, neuroscience, urology, and many more.

SERVICES PROVIDED

The Department of Pharmacy Services is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Pharmacists work directly with physicians, nurses, and allied health personnel, in a decentralized practice model. Distributive pharmacy services are provided through the Central Pharmacy together with decentralized automated dispensing cabinets and pharmacy satellites. Unit-based pharmacists are also located in the emergency department, critical care, and select medicine units.

Jersey Shore University Medical Center has 4 full-time PGY1 pharmacy residents and a Rutgers University PGY2 pediatric pharmacy resident rotating two months of the year. The hospital is an academic teaching and practice site for Rutgers University, Ernest Mario School of Pharmacy, featuring faculty with specialties in pediatrics, internal medicine, and cardiology. Additionally,

other clinical services offered include transitions of care, emergency medicine, critical care, antimicrobial stewardship, oncology, and medication safety.
