SERVICES PROVIDED

The Department of Pharmacy is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Pharmacists work directly with physicians, nurses, and allied health personnel, in a decentralized practice model. Distributive pharmacy services are provided through the main pharmacy in conjunction with automated dispensing cabinets.

Clinical pharmacy services include emergency medicine, internal medicine, transitions of care, oncology, medication safety, critical care and antimicrobial stewardship. PMPMC has 2 PGY-1 pharmacy residents and a PGY-2 pharmacy residency in internal medicine.

PMPMC pharmacists routinely precept students from various schools of pharmacy. PMPMC is an academic teaching and practice site for the Rutgers University, Ernest Mario School of Pharmacy.
