Purpose:

The intent of this program is to provide continual preceptor development to pharmacists who precept students in the Intermediate and Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences. The program will focus on the Pharmacists' Patient Care Process (PPCP). The PPCP is a five-step process that can be used as a framework for delivering pharmacists' patient care services in any practice setting. Pharmacists will learn to use a patient-centered approach in collaboration with other health care providers to optimize patient health and medication outcomes.

Learning Objectives for Pharmacists:

At the completion of this program, the pharmacist participant will be able to:

- Describe the Pharmacists' Patient Care Process
- Describe how the PPCP is utilized throughout a Pharmacy Curriculum
- List specific ways that the PPCP can be integrated into multiple disease states and different types of pharmacy practice settings
- Discuss PPCP activities that can be incorporated within an experiential setting
- Identify ways of evaluating student pharmacists' ability to perform PPCP activities in the experiential setting
- Compare and contrast PPCP activities that can be incorporated within a community and hospital setting
