ABOUT US

Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital (RWJUH) in New Brunswick, an RWJBarnabas Health facility, is an academic medical center whose Centers of Excellence include cardiovascular care from minimally invasive heart surgery to transplantation, cancer care, stroke care, neuroscience, joint replacement, and women's and children's care including The Bristol-Myers Squibb Children's Hospital (BMSCH). Nationally ranked as a U.S. News & World Report Best Children's Hospital, BMSCH serves as the focal point of New Brunswick's only academic pediatric health campus, which includes the Rutgers Child Health Institute, PSE&G Children's Specialized Hospital, and Ronald McDonald House. The 105-bed, state-designated, acute care children's hospital is a state-of-the-art facility that is specially designed to care for children. From pediatric surgery, urology and cardiology to oncology, hematology and pulmonology, BMSCH's specialists and intensivists provide advanced care for children of all ages-from fragile newborns to adolescents. As the flagship Cancer Hospital of the Rutgers Cancer Institute, the only NCI-designated Cancer Center in the state and the future home of the Jack and Sheryl Morris Cancer Center, RWJUH is an innovative leader in advancing cancer care and research. Through its deep partnership with Rutgers University, RWJUH delivers the highest levels of care in the state and region, serving as a state-accredited Level 1 Trauma Center and a Level II Pediatric Trauma Center, a kidney, pancreas and heart transplantation program, a cardiovascular and neuroscience center of excellence and advance GI program.

SERVICES PROVIDED

The Pharmacy Department provides decentralized services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, with specialized pharmaceutical services provided throughout the hospital. At RWJUH, pharmacists serve as active participants in the interdisciplinary healthcare team. RWJUH provides graduate and post-graduate learners with opportunities to participate on a variety of committees and interact with different healthcare professionals in addition to their clinical rotations.

RWJUH offers an array of inpatient and outpatient pharmacy services. These specialties include Critical Care, Drug Information/Medication Safety, Emergency Medicine, Infectious Disease/Antimicrobial Stewardship, Internal Medicine, Management/Administration, Oncology, Pediatrics, Solid Organ Transplant, and Transitions of Care. Additionally, RWJUH also hosts a PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program (2 positions), a PGY2 Emergency Medicine Pharmacy Residency Program (2 positions), and a PGY2 Medication-Use Safety and Policy Residency Program (2 positions).
